The day the Roseville fire department burned down the house on our property was a big day. Several hundred people gathered to watch and I believe over a thousand drove by. A member approached, grabbed my arm in her excitement and said with all sincerity “Look at all these people! We should do this every year!” I agree! While we can’t go burning down a structure on our property every year, we can generate experiences that show we are burning, that something is really happening here.

“Long overdue! Long overdue!” is what a member told me at an Adult Forum. The topic was a progress report on the new position descriptions for our pastors. She was happy with the progress, but would have been happier if it had come awhile, even years, before. The sanctuary and narthex renewal are obvious signs as is our commitment to children’s ministry with the hire of Tammy Wilkinson as Children’s Ministry Coordinator. Our renewal efforts are beginning to show, but much like a tree that is blossoming again, we do not yet have an experience of the fruit. We must continue our efforts and pick up the pace. Needs that have waited for a long time cannot wait any longer. While this is true of our building, it is also true for our programming. Strides were made in 2008; your expectations for greater things from Prince of Peace will help us truly become a Lutheran Church for these times.

I’ll close with another quote that inspires me nearly every day. Martin Luther is the source: “We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it.”

Message from Pastor Anita Beste



As I write this it is Day 14 in the newly erupted conflict between Israelis and Palestinians in Gaza. As I pray for peace in the region I am also praying for safety for the group of ELCA bishops and their spouses currently in the region. And I give thanks for the courageous witness of their faith.

The trip had been planned for 2 years but there was serious conversation about whether it should still happen when the new violence began. I was moved by the email from our Bishop, Peter Rogness, when he let us know the trip would proceed. Given the increased personal risks, individual decisions whether to participate or not were encouraged and honored. Bishop Rogness – along with 44 others -- decided to go. I was moved because I'm always heartened and encouraged by actions that are motivated and shaped by our faith – especially acts of courage in the face of some personal risk. I think it embodies faithful following of the Jesus who says to us "Follow me." We follow Jesus in the twin paths of his life: seeking out the suffering and speaking truth to power.

Here is more from Bishop Rogness' email: At the heart of ELCA global mission theology and practice is the principle of accompaniment. That is, our global activity (unlike 100 years ago) is less often to people who have never heard the Christian message; rather, it is more often to give support and encouragement to Christian communities in other parts of the world as they live out our common life as the body of Christ in those places. The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL) is a small, but vital, church that serves as a beacon of hope for a Palestinian population for whom life is hard. Bishop Munib Younan is respected among his people, a tireless advocate for peace and reconciliation. He has been instrumental in planning this trip and has re-affirmed that our presence there at this time would be helpful and would confirm our commitment to being peacemakers. In addition, the Israeli consul general has urged us not to abandon the trip. Participation positions our church to become greater advocates for peace in this part of the world and a blessing to those who live in the midst of violence, suffering, and uncertainty on a daily basis. I've thought about whether the three purposes of the academy trip--accompaniment, advocacy, and awareness--are achievable, and it seems to me they are. The principle of accompaniment is pivotal, and the fact that those who will be our hosts--on whom the burden of our presence in tense times falls--still want the trip to happen is almost determinative in itself. If my presence helps them, that's enough for me. That's the accompaniment factor. The fact that the world's attention is so focused at this time may well make more effective our advocacy for peacemaking, both within the church and in the public arena. Certainly our awareness of these complex issues will be heightened. So even though the nature of the academy will change somewhat, I'm convinced the purposes are very much in play.



Last summer, Finding the Way gathered once a week in the month of July to do a variety of fun filled activities. One of the activities we did each week was to make and bake bread together. At first, I wasn't sure how this was going to go. Making bread with 12 kids is no easy task. However, what I soon learned was that in making and breaking bread together, it helped us to form a community.

The word "community" became an important part of our vocabulary. We started asking questions like, "What does it mean to be in a community?" "Why do we care about being part of a community?" and "What makes our community special?" You see, even today I still talk to kids who attended Finding the Way, and what I hear from them are their memories about

baking bread together and being with their friends. In

Communion, we will be offering training. As part of this training, I am also inviting First Communion candidates to come and bake bread with me. I will share some of the history of bread and how it relates to our Savior. We get our hands all gooey. Most of all, we will come together as brothers and sisters in Christ to form our own little community.

First Communion for Children – of all ages

Children of all ages are welcome to receive communion at Prince of Peace. Parents – together with their children – decide when their children will first receive this sacrament based on several factors including interest expressed, child development, family tradition, siblings, etc.

We do ask that children receive some preparation in anticipation of their first communion as a way of welcoming them to the table and fostering an age-appropriate understanding of participation in communion as one of God's mean of grace.

This can be done in one of two ways:

- 1) Speak to one of the pastors, arrange to meet as a family for instruction and preparation, and then participate any communion Sunday throughout the year; or
- 2) Attend – as a family – the *First Communion Class* offered during Lent and receive first communion at the Maundy Thursday service together with others from the class.

This year, First Communion will be on Maundy Thursday, April 9 at the 7:00 service. The First Communion preparation class will be scheduled for March or early April.

Last night 12 of us gathered to watch the three “Matrix” movies. These movies push us to ask questions about what we believe. Who is God? Where do we find him? What is reality? What does the world look like? How do we decide what we believe? What has God saved us from? For? What is our responsibility to the common good?

I appreciate so much the honesty with which young people are able to talk about what they believe and what they do not believe. Their ability to listen to thoughts and beliefs of others amaze me. At their age I know that I did not willingly examine beliefs different from my own for any other purpose than to convince them “I was right. And they were wrong.”

The gift that many of our young people have today that I did not have was the ability to trust their own belief system. Our young people have taken the time over their short lives to assess and evaluate who God is and God’s place in the world and their lives.

Listening to young people share their insights and questions allows me to appreciate their faith. Their faith is personal. It is important to them. It is about a God bigger than all of us. Their faith is about a God of love. It is about a God who cares for ALL of creation. I am honored to be trusted with their understanding of God. Thank you for the privilege to be part of the conversation about faith and God.

March is Minnesota FoodShare Month

At Prince of Peace we will start the campaign for **food** and **cash donations** at the Ash Wednesday Worship Service on February 25 and continue through March. There will be food and cash collections as usual on the 1st and 3rd Communion Sundays. Minnesota FoodShare directs the largest food drive in the state to restock about 300 food shelves across Minnesota. Due to the poor economic times food shelf use is up 13% as of November.

Cash stretches the one dollar to five dollars worth of food if purchased by the food banks. Food especially needed: canned meats and fish, canned vegetables and fruit, dried fruit, packaged and canned soups and stews, cold and hot cereals, pasta, rice, toilet paper, and soaps.
